## Roma Caput Mundi .. Rome ~ Capital of the World

*Home to the Colosseum, Pantheon and Vatican City, this Italian capital grants visitors stunning views into the great legacy that is Rome.*

*A good starting point when exploring Rome would be the Vatican City, the sovereign state ruled by the Pope. Located within its borders are St. Peter's Basilica, Square and the Vatican Mseum. The museum is mainly known for its Sistine Chapel, although other notable artworks by Raphael, Caravaggio and others can also be found there.*

*To delve further back into Rome's past, a visit to the Pantheon and the Colosseum are a must. These remnants of the Roman Empire have inspired both European and American architects for centuries.*

*Near the Pantheon is the Trevi Fountain, the city's largest fountain. It is the endpoint of the Acqua Vergine, an ancient aqueduct that brought clean water into Rome.*

*There is a coin throwing tradition popular with visitors to the fountain. Legend has it that good luck is bestowed upon the person who throws a coin with their right hand over their right shoulder into the fountain.*

*Whether you choose to believe the legend or not, getting a chance to experience Rome and all it has to offer can make anyone feel pretty lucky indeed!*

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## Firenze

*A high concentration of Renaissance art, culture and architecture make Florence the top tourist destination for those visiting Italy.*

*This city is renowned for its fine leather and handmade ceramics, and Florence's outdoor markets are a great place to find unique gifts and apparel.*

*Considered the jewel of Tuscany, the city's museums hold one-third of the worlds most recognized art treasures. But a walk through Florence's streets and beautiful piazzas makes one thing clear; the city itself is a piece of art.*

*Santa Maria del Fiore, more commonly known as the Duomo, is a prime example. Massive, ornate, and taking centuries to build, the duomo dominates the city's center. Its cupola, completed in 1436, was the first of its kind and still holds the record for the largest masonry dome in the world. For art aficionados and novices alike, the adjacent belltower and Baptistry are equally breathtaking.*

*Located near the Duomo is Dante's House, a museum that pays homage to the great poet, Dante Aligheri.*

*Though there is too much to see for one day, ITR provides you with a great introduction to this Renaissance city.*
